UNATTENDED CHILDREN

Unattended minors must be picked up at least 15 minutes before the library closes.

In the case of a child who is unattended at closing time (including emergency closings), the library staff will attempt to notify the child's parent or adult caregiver. If the parent or caregiver cannot be located within 15 minutes, the library staff will notify law enforcement and wait with the child until an officer arrives.

Library staff members may not take the child home or anywhere away from the library grounds.



MATERIALS

The library respects the rights of youth to choose their own materials. The library recognizes that some materials may be controversial and/or offensive to an individual. Only the individual can define what materials are consistent with his/her own values. Individuals can apply those values to the use of library materials only for themselves. It is the responsibility of the parent to monitor the materials their children borrow or use in the library.
